This month of February 2026, our “**Kingdom Truth News**” Teaching is about “**Well Done Good and Faithful Servant**” and “**Christian Stewardship, God’s Way**”.

“**Stop**” Pray and ask the Holy Spirit (author of the Bible) to help you understand this Teaching.

A Spiritual Tip: To get full results and benefit from our Kingdom Truth teaching, we recommend a person READ (aloud), MEDITATE, and APPLY.

Foundational Scriptures

Then Jesus said to those Jews who believed Him, “If you will abide in my word, you are my disciples indeed. And you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free.” John 8:31-32 (NKJ)

“But seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you.” Matthew 6:33 (NKJ)

His Lord said to him, ‘Well done, good and faithful servant; you have been faithful (good steward) over a few things, I will make you ruler over many things. Enter the joy of your Lord.’ Matthew 25:23 (NKJ)

“Let us be glad and rejoice and give Him glory, for the marriage of the Lamb has come, and His (Jesus) wife (bride of Christ/Born Again Believers) has made herself ready.” Revelation 19:7 (NKJ)

Then he said to me, “Write: ‘Blessed are those (Born Again Believers) who are called to the marriage supper of the Lamb!’” Revelation 19:9a (NKJ)

1. Who is a faithful servant?

- A. **Being Available** – If we make ourselves available, we will be more faithful, but the world competes with our time and resources. It can be a battle of the flesh and the Spirit. God often gives us opportunities to serve or share Christ, but sometimes we are thinking of ourselves too much in fear of rejection. Let us face it, we all like to be liked, but that is not what we are called to. We are called to share Christ, and serve Christ by serving others, which Jesus takes personally (Matthew 25:40). The day will come when each of us will give an account of ourselves to God (Romans 14:12). For some that will be a day of rejoicing, but for others, it will be a day of shame as they knew they were negligent of their calling, doing little or nothing for Christ. The Apostle John wrote in that context, saying, “**And now, little children, abide in Him, that when He appears, we may have confidence and not be ashamed before Him at His coming**” (1 John 2:28). “**If you are abiding in Me, and My Words abide in you, you will ask what you desire, and it shall be done for you. By this My Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit and so you will be My disciples**” (John 15:7-8). It is not so much ability as it is availability. I believe 90% of being a faithful servant is simply being available!
- B. **Being Teachable** - One way to look at being faithful is to be abiding in Jesus Words, and those Words are found in scripture. The more we read the Bible, the more it reads us, and shows us where we come up short, but it also shows us ways we can be more faithful, and that should be our desire; to be good and faithful servants. One aspect of being a faithful servant is sitting at the Master's feet and learning from Him, and that means reading His book, the Bible, and to spend time in meditation. This book helps us to yield to the Holy Spirit more easily. The Bible helps us grow in holiness (sanctification), teaches us how to witness, and reveals those who are Jesus' disciples (**John 13:34-35**). A faithful servant learns from the Master, so more time spent with the Master and His Word, the more you will naturally want to serve Christ (**Matthew 25:35-36,40**). A person who has their portion of His daily bread (**Matthew 4:4**) will recognize serving or witnessing opportunities when they see them.
- C. **Being Faithful** – What Believer's should long for is the day when Jesus will say to them, “Well done,” good and faithful servant; you have been faithful (good steward) over a little; I will make you ruler over many things. Enter the joy of your Lord” (**Matthew 25:23**). Jesus does not say “good and gifted servant,” or “good and skilled servant.” It is being **faithful** where He puts the emphasis. So, what does it mean to be faithful, particularly a faithful servant of Christ? You do not have to look far to find

out what we are commanded to do (**Matthew 25:35-36**, James 1:27). **“Moreover, it is required in stewards that they be found faithful.”** (I Corinthians 4:2)

Conclusion

Today is closer than yesterday to the day when Jesus will say to some, **“Well done” good and faithful servant; you have been faithful over a few things; I will make you ruler over many things. Enter the joy of your Lord”** (Matthew 25-23a). Jesus is looking for those who will be faithful, who will make themselves available, those who will be open and remain teachable (no pride), and to be flexible in whatever situation God has placed them in. The Lord has shown us that **“Real Ministry”** is meeting the needs of people, spiritually, physically, and materially, and do it in Jesus Name. The rewards will be out of this world.

2. “Christian Stewardship, God’s Way”

- A. We have found over many years in the Teaching and Discipleship Ministry, that many Christians have trouble with becoming a **Good Steward**. Fortunately, and thankfully, we were able to discover this especially important Truth and Blessing early in our walk with Jesus, for all these years. We see the problem of materialism everywhere, including with many Christians. Do not get me wrong, God is noticeably clear that He wants to prosper us. But He expects the money and possessions that He brings into our hands to be overseen properly, because it is God’s money and God’s possessions. He wants us to be **Good Stewards** of His property, according to the Bible.

Therefore, we want to help Christians that are struggling with being a **Good Steward**, to understand what God says about this every important subject. And we are teaching/speaking to both the rich and to the more common person still struggling with finances, and everyone in between.

Caution - This is neither a prosperity nor poverty message; but it is Biblical, Stewardship Teaching.

But seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you. (blessings God’s way) Matthew 6:33 (NKJ)

“Let a man so consider us, as servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God. Moreover, it is required in stewards that one be found faithful.”

I Corinthians 4:1-2 (NKJ)

- “Command those who are rich in this present age not to be haughty (prideful), nor to trust in uncertain riches but in the living God, who gives us richly all things to enjoy. Let them do good, that they be rich in good

works, ready to give, willing to share, storing up for themselves a good foundation for the time to come, that they may lay hold on eternal life.” I Timothy 6:17-19

- “And now, little children abide in Him, that when He appears, we may have confidence and not be ashamed before Him at His coming.” I John 2:28
 - “I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a **living sacrifice**, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service. And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the **renewing of your mind**, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and **perfect will of God.**” Romans 12:1-2
 - “**Therefore, if you have not been faithful** (servant) **in the unrighteous mammon** (money), **who will commit to your trust the true riches?**” Luke 16:11 (NKJ)
 - “Do not love the world or the things (materialism) in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. For all that is in the world - the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life - is not of the Father but is of the world. And the world is passing away, and the lust of it; but he who does the will of God abides forever.” I John 2:15-17 (NKJ)
- B. **“Paul’s Journey to Jerusalem:** So now, brethren, I commend you to God and to the word of His grace, which can build you up and give you an inheritance among all those who are **sanctified**. I have coveted no one’s silver or gold or apparel. Yes, you yourselves know that these hands have provided for my necessities, and for those who were with me. I have shown you in every way, by laboring like this, that **you** must support the weak. And remember the words of the Lord Jesus, that He said, **“It is more blessed to give than to receive.”** Acts 20:32-35 (NKJ)
- C. “Now it shall come to pass, if you diligently obey the voice of the Lord your God, to observe carefully all His commandments which I command you today, that the Lord your God will set you high above all nations of the earth. And all these blessings shall come upon you and overtake you, because you obey the voice of the Lord your God:” Deuteronomy 28:1-2 (NKJ)
- **“Give, and it will be given to you: good measure, press down, shaking together, and running over will be put into your bosom. For with the same measure that you use, it will be measured back to you.** Luke 6:38 (NKJ)
 - “Beloved, I pray that in every way you may **succeed and prosper** and be in health [physically], just as [I know] your soul prospers [spiritually]. For I was pleased when [some of the] brothers came [from time to time] and testified to your [faithfulness to the] **truth** [of the gospel message], that

is, how you are walking in truth. I have **no greater joy** than this, to hear that my [spiritual] children are living [their lives] in the truth." III John 1:2-3 (AMP)

D. We all need to consider and make sure we are fulfilling the purpose which God has for each one of us, while we are still here on earth. In other words, have we found our "**lane**" yet, in life. We have mentioned many scriptures in this teaching to help us make the right decisions in our lives. Here are some concluding thoughts from God's Word on the purpose for our lives while on earth.

- "For by **grace** you have been **saved** through **faith**, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, not of works, lest anyone should boast. For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should **walk in them.**" Ephesians 2:8-10 (NKJ)
- "But the **end of all things is at hand**; therefore, be serious, be watchful in your prayers. And above all things have fervent love for one another, for love will cover a multitude of sins. Be hospitable to one another without grumbling. And as each one has received a gift, minister it to one another, as **good stewards** of the manifold grace of God. If anyone speaks, let him speak as the oracles of God. If anyone ministers, let him do it as with the ability which God supplies, that in all things God may be glorified through **Jesus Christ**, to whom belong the glory and the dominion forever and ever. Amen" I Peter 4:7-11 (NKJ)
- "Likewise, you younger people, submit yourselves to your elders. Yes, all of you be submissive to one another, and be clothed with humility, for **" God resists the proud but gives grace to the humble."** Therefore, humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God, that He may exalt you in time, casting all your care upon Him, for He cares for you. Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil walks about like a roaring lion, seeking whom he may devour. Resist him, steadfast in faith, knowing that the same sufferings are experienced by your brotherhood in the world. But may the God of all grace, who called us to His eternal glory by Christ Jesus, after you have suffered a while, perfect, establish, strengthen, and settle you. To Him be the glory and the dominion forever and ever. Amen" I Peter 5:5-11 (NKJ)

Three of the possible Biblical forms of giving are: tithe, offerings, and alms, which we did not get into because we wanted to concentrate on Biblical Stewardship and being a faithful servant, which is especially important. Also, we never want to forget that in the Kingdom of God, we look strongly at believing in "**Real Ministry**," mentioned in 1, C Conclusion.

A Truth-Teller in an Age of Lies by Benny Johnson

Charlie Kirk was allergic to lies. Whether they came from government, academia, or corporate media, he exposed them with the precision of a surgeon and the boldness of a prophet. But his goal was never destruction – it was redemption. He did not want to cancel anyone; He wanted them to wake up. He believed that truth was the ultimate act of love – that telling people the truth about sin, about culture, about eternity was not cruelty, but compassion. And at an age when so many were afraid to speak, he spoke. Loudly. Clearly. Unapologetically. He knew it would cost him friends, followers, and opportunities. But he also knew that silence was a greater sin. “Truth doesn’t need permission,” he once told his followers, “It needs courage.” That courage was his trademark. Whether debating professors or interviewing pastors, Charlie was animated by the same conviction: that truth is not just an idea to be discussed – it is a Person to be known. “Jesus said, I am the Truth,” he would remind his audience. That means every lie, every deception, every distortion sets itself against Him.

A Commentary by Jonathan Cahn, on the Charlie Kirk effect

It was not long ago that the Christian activist, Charlie Kirk, was assassinated. I had shared on YouTube that two days before the assassination, a post was put on the web detailing how the author, a feminist, had employed several witches to place a curse on Charlie Kirk. In two days he was assassinated. No witch has the power to do anything except that God allows it, and God allowed it. At the same time, the involvement of witches is part of a larger picture – spiritual warfare. The assassination of Charlie Kirk was part of a war that is being waged for the future of America. On one side, are those who seek to preserve the Christian biblical foundation and values upon which America has long stood. On the other side, are those who seek to overturn Those values and that foundation. The place in which Kirk was killed was Orem, Utah. The word Orem means Serpent or Dragon, the description of Satan. The name, Kirk means Church. So, the

man named Church came to the place called Serpent or Dragon – and there, the dragon struck him. The Dragon wars against the Church. It is also worthy of note the Kirk was struck in his throat – for the enemy is seeking to silence the Church. But the Church as born in the death and resurrection of Messiah. And so, death is never the last word but only the first. In Messiah, death leads to life. It is not an exaggeration to say that Charlie Kirk was a martyr. He died while bearing witness and, because of bearing witness to God and His ways. It has been said that the blood of the martyrs is the seed of the Church. And so, it has been with the death and blood of Charlie Kirk. It has not silenced the church nor intimidated it. Instead, it has strengthened and emboldened it. Since his death and because of it, there has been a noticeable increase in people coming to Church, especially of the young. There has been a turning among Generation Z, especially among young man, to the Lord and to biblical values. And there has been a renewed conviction among believers of every kind to live all out for God and for the Gospel.
